

Stalling Frequently Asked Questions.

Q: How do I find someone to share a stall with?

A: Go to www.WSCA.org and click on the stall sharing link. There you will find other contestants looking to share stalls.

Q: Who pays for the deposit?

A: It is suggested that the game person write the deposit check. The \$25 deposit will be refunded when the game rider checks out only. It is encouraged to have the game rider write the stall deposit check. No stall deposit checks will be returned until the stall is completely checked out. Last year there were pleasure people who had stall deposits that could not be returned until the game person either checked out or brought a new stall deposit check to the barn office. The last person using the stall must check out with the barn office before you leave or your deposit check will be cashed. There are no refunds if you forget to check out with the barn office and your check gets cashed.

Q: Can we each pay \$12.50 for the deposit?

A: Yes, but remember, only after the game person checks out will any deposit be given back. This includes the \$12.50 the pleasure person paid. Deposits on stalls are \$25.

Q: I'm a pleasure rider and I shown in Egg n' Spoon. Can I still share a stall with a game person?

A: Yes, but you need to coordinate the arrival and departure dates with the person you are sharing the stall with. Some game people arrive in the AM on Saturday. There were major problems last year with stall overlap. There were pleasure riders in Egg & Spoon who agreed to share stalls and were not out of the stalls before the game people arrived. Again, it is up to the people sharing the stalls when the pleasure person should be out of the stall and when the game person arrives.

Q: My saddle club is sending in to share 25 stalls. Do the deposit checks need to be written out individually?

A: Deposit checks can be sent in individually or one check for \$625 could be written in this case. The deposit check would not be given back until the last person checks out of the stall. All 25 stalls would be checked when the last person checks out.

Q: My saddle club always requests the tie-stalls in the Annex. We would like to share this year, is it permissible?

A: Yes, the same rules apply to tie-stalls as box stalls. The only difference is the price of a tie-stall is \$25 with a \$25 deposit.

Q: Is sharing permitted for In/Out permits?

A: No, In/Out permits are intended for individuals showing only one day. For example; an English only contestant could request an In/Out permit for only the day those classes are held. The permit is only good for that day and that contestant and horse.

Q: Who pays for the shared stall?

A: Each person sharing the stall is suggested to pay \$35 since a single stall for the full show is \$70. These arrangements are solely between the people sharing stalls. The WSCA is not monitoring this activity and the \$35 is only a suggestion. It is up to the people sharing the stalls the exact amount each person pays.

Q: I'm sharing a stall with another person; do we still need another contestant to get a tack stall?

A: There must be three contestants/horses per tack stall. There has been no change to this rule. All requested tack stalls must have three horses or they will not be honored. All three should be sent in at the same time. Last year there were some contestants who had three horses but the forms were not sent in together. Unfortunately, these people were not put together.

Q: I entered my horse but now he's lame, can I get my stalling money back?

A: No, there are no refunds on stalling. You can find someone to sell your stall to as long as this is coordinated with the stalling person or barn office manager.

Q: I sent in my stalling & entries and then my horse had an accident. I did not sell my stall to any else yet my deposit check was still cashed, why?

A: Unless you call or go to the barn office and tell someone, we have no way of knowing if you used your stall or if it was dirty. At the end of the show, any stall deposit check left will be cashed. It is your responsibility to notify the stalling coordinator or barn manager if you do not use your stall.

Q: I show in pleasure, what is the earliest I can arrive and unload?

A: The earliest you will be allowed anywhere near the barns are 9AM, no exceptions. The barns will not open before 9AM on Thursday September 18th 2008.

Q: Will the barn office sell shavings again this year?

A: yes, there will be shavings sold in the same manner as last year.

Q: I wanted to be stalled near my friends last year but did not send in my forms with them. I ended up in a different barn, away from my friends, how can I avoid that this year?

A: Send in your stalling forms together and the likelihood you will be together increases dramatically. There are no promises made on stalling together although we will try our best to accommodate your request when sent together.
